Appointments

St. Ferdinand teachers pride themselves in their professionalism. It is important for them to be available to their students during the school day. If you wish to speak to a teacher, please make an appointment with them for a mutually convenient time. Appointments to meet the principal should be made in advance. <u>Teachers are responsible for the learning and safety of all students from</u> 8:00 A.M. until 3:00 P.M. No one is allowed to stop by a classroom to confer with a teacher.

As the faculty is not able to leave any classroom while students are present, and as not to disrupt the classroom lessons, parents/guardians are required not to enter the classrooms during the school day. As well, parents/guardians are required not to ask teachers to leave the classroom during the regular school day unless a conference time has been previously arranged.

<u>Please remember teachers have faculty meetings each Wednesday immediately after school,</u> and are not available at that time for an appointment.

Absences/Tardiness

Teaching children to be on time starts very early in life. When they arrive on time and are picked up on time, children are learning life-long skills. The school day begins at 8:00 A.M. Children are counted tardy if they arrive after 8:05 A.M. We understand that sometimes things happen which will affect your being on time, if your child is going to be late, a phone call must be made to the school office before 7:45 informing us that your child/children will be arriving late. A phone call received while your child is rushing to the door is not acceptable
