OFRENDAS - INTERESTED IN DISPLAYING ONE IN OUR CHAPEL?

An "ofrenda" is an altar dedicated to a beloved deceased family member in which food and personal items the departed enjoyed while on earth are displayed, as well as photos and religious items and flowers. It is a tradition in many Spanish-speaking countries to erect ofrendas in the home or even on gravesites during Dias de los Muertos at the beginning of November, coinciding with the Christian All Saints and All Souls Days. The junior high classes will be designing miniature ofrendas as a project in their Spanish classes, which will be on display at the front entrance for Parent-Teacher Conferences. It would be wonderful to be able to have lifesize ofrendas on display in our Chapel for the Oct. 20th Family Mass and then remain there through at least Conference Day, Oct 25th.
