**ACT Aspire Tests** This year, the ACT Aspire tests will not be administered across the Archdiocese due to complications with ensuring validity due to pandemic and remote learning situations. I-ready diagnostic testing will be administered in late spring instead. I-Ready provides individual student growth data, as well as information on grade level achievement compared to national norms, just as the ACT Aspire testing did.

**Easter Vacation** Easter vacation will be April 1<sup>st</sup> – April 9<sup>th</sup>. The best and safest thing is not to travel, due to COVID and quarantines. It has been the cooperation of adherence to safety protocol and quarantine guidance that has kept the St. Ferdinand School community safe and healthy – and we hope the continued practice of safe actions will keep us healthy for the rest of the school year. Orange states still require a 10-day quarantine; please let your child's teachers and the office know if you will be traveling to an orange state or out of the country over Spring Break. Beginning with the 2020/2021 school year, all Families must have either a checking/savings account or credit card linked to their FACTS account. All families that currently have an invoice account will need to sign into their FACTS account to add your preferred payment method. ***This is not optional.***

**GRADES/HONOR ROLL** - Please note, the grade scale for Specials Classes (Physical Education, Fine Arts, Spanish, Technology) has changed. **These classes are now using the +, S, and – grade scale.**

S (satisfactory work)  
- (unsatisfactory work)

For the A/High Honor Roll, Grades 4-8 students need to have all A's in the subject areas still being graded, and +'s in the Specials.

For the B Honor Roll, Grades 4-8 students need to earn a combo of A's and B's (no C's or lower), and have all +'s and S's (no -'s) in the Specials.

**Gym Uniforms** - Please make sure you have the correct gym uniform! Last year was the final transition year for uniforms. This year, all gym uniforms should be the navy blue ones, as offered through **Dennis Uniform**. ***If you do not have the correct uniform, this will start to be reflected in your grade.***

**Sweaters/ Uniforms** - **As the weather is getting colder, please remember to dress appropriately ... students should now be in pants, NOT walking shorts.** Make sure to bring your St. Ferdinand School fleece sweater jacket (the Dennis Uniform one) to wear during the school day. Due to COVID, we do need to keep the windows open to provide more ventilation – and as the temperature drops outside, so does the temperature in the classroom.
