<u>2022-2023 Registration</u> Thank you to everyone who has returned their Intent to Return Forms. We had over 85% of families take advantage of the FEBRUARY FREEZE Early Bird Tuition Discount Sign-Up! If you have not already returned your 2022/2023 tuition agreement, please send it in as soon as possible along with the \$100.00 registration fee. It is not too late to register for the 2022/2023 school year! If you are not returning to St. Ferdinand School in the Fall, please inform the school office.

Please note: On the 22-23 Tuition Contracts, there was a typo in the date in the section where people select their service hour option. Participation hours are due by March 30, 2023, as they always have been. The information on participation hours is written out correctly when it states "\*10 hours of participation per family is required, if not completed by March 30, 2023, you will be assessed a Parent Service surcharge..." However, in the next box, when asked to select the option for the parent service program, the numerical date is incorrect. It should read: "\_\_\_\_\_ Complete hours by 03/30/2023", in order to match the written information above that section.

**Summer Camp Returns!** We are pleased to announce that our Summer Camp Program will be returning this year for students turning 4 by 9/1/22 through students entering 5<sup>th</sup> grade! Summer Camp will begin on June 27, 2022, and will last for 6 weeks. This has been a very popular program in previous years, and a great opportunity for students to have fun while learning and socialize with peers. **Notification from FACTS Regarding Credit Cards** FACTS has notified us that due to changes in the market, they are adjusting the rates and fees associated with credit/debit card transactions. Beginning April 25, 2022, the fee for credit card/debit transactions will be 2.95%. Save money and use your checking account instead of your debit/credit card.

<u>Mask Policy Changes</u> The Archdiocese of Chicago released a letter stating that beginning Monday, February 28, masks will be optional in the schools. This is in accordance with recent changes to the Chicago and Illinois mask policy. However, because Covid is still

prevalent, as well as because many of our younger students are not yet eligible for vaccines and some members of our school community are immunocompromised, we are strongly encouraging the continued use of face masks in the school. There will be times when masks will be necessary, especially when social distance guidelines cannot be maintained. It is our hope that we can continue to mitigate the spread of Covid and keep everyone healthy by having masks when needed. Please see the School Messenger message that went out to parents this morning for further correspondence and information regarding masks.

<u>SAFETY AT DISMISSAL TIME:</u> It has come to our attention from our crossing guard that dangerous situations are taking place at dismissal time. To ensure the safety of our children, parents, teachers, the St. Patrick High School community, and our crossing guard, please:

- Do NOT double-park along Mason.
- Do NOT park in the alley off of Mason; the neighbors are complaining about obstruction down the one-way alley
- If parked on Mason, only travel on it heading south to leave the school premises do NOT back up onto Belmont to exit
- Get out of your car to pick up your child and walk him/her to your vehicle after acknowledging your presence to your child's teacher
- Consider using our ample parking lot and exiting out Marmora there is plenty of room and space for all, with no street for your child to cross

Thank you for your immediate cooperation with this, and thank you to those who already do park in safe ways at pick-up.

<u>Financial Aid/Scholarships</u> - The 2022/2023 FACTS Grant & Aid application is now open. If you receive any type of financial aid/scholarship through the Archdiocese, (Phoenix, COVID Relief or Access), McGraw Foundation, or St. Ferdinand School, you are required to fill out a Grant & Aid Application for the 2022/2023 school year. Please note: <u>Per scholarship rules, no financial aid/scholarships will be considered without this application.</u>

<u>Illness / Covid Protocol Reminders</u> – Just a reminder, if your student is feeling sick, please do not send them to school. Please contact the office to let us know why your student will not be in school.

We ask that parents/guardians continue to monitor your child for the following COVID symptoms:

- Fever
- Congestion/cough/sore throat new symptoms with Omicron variant
- Runny nose
- Loss of taste or smell symptom of Delta variant
- Lethargy/extreme sluggishness

If someone tests positive for COVID, regardless of vaccination status, the individual must:

- Isolate for a full 5 days regardless if symptoms are present or not and regardless if any symptoms resolve before the 5 days are complete.
- If asymptomatic or symptoms resolve before the fifth day, the individual must still complete the full five days of isolation and must wear a mask around others for five more days.
- The individual must be fever-free for 24 hours before leaving isolation. The 5-day rule still applies, but if a fever is present after 5 days, the individual must remain isolated until fever-free for 24 hours.
- Masks will need to be worn if a student returns to school, even if symptom-free, for Days 6-10 after diagnosis.

## If a vaccinated individual is a close contact with a positive individual:

- There is no need to quarantine at home as long as the individual is not symptomatic. The individual must wear a mask around others for 10 days after exposure.
- Testing is recommended 1, 3, and 5 days after exposure OR if symptoms develop.

## If an unvaccinated individual is a close contact with a positive individual:

- The individual must quarantine at home for 5 days and continue to wear a mask around others for 5 more days.
- Testing is recommended 1, 3, and 5 days after exposure OR if symptoms develop

All cars MUST pull over on either side of the street if you want to get out of your car and walk your child in! Do not leave your vehicle unattended in the middle of the street in the morning. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

<u>iWatches/Smart Watches</u> – are not allowed on the children during school hours! They need to be kept at home OR kept in backpacks in the lockers during the school day.
