Bottom line: looks like I will still be given the task to be principal at St. Ferdinand School for the foreseeable future.

I have, however, just begun radiation treatments, which will last all of this month. There will not be any visible change in my appearance, but I just wanted you to be aware if I am not as available to meet with you, due to my session times necessitating that I leave school by 3:05 everyday. I hope to make it back for Friday Fish Fries and our Queen of Hearts Raffle, but we shall see if the effects of the treatments (extreme tiredness, pain at the site of radiation) prevent that from happening, or cause me to work from home a day or two as the month goes on.

If I ever cross your mind, please keep me in your prayers for continued strength through this important step in my care. Know that I have prayers of gratitude each day for my role as leader of St. Ferdinand School, as well as for the love and laughter that I experience each day from my interactions with your children, the teachers and staff, and with many of you - which focus my mind on all God has blessed me with in my professional life..
